

Guidelines for eHands-on Course

This format is ideally suited where the learning objectives include virtual screening methods to support the diagnosis, treatment strategies, or reading skills of images.



90 min

SESSION FORMAT AND STRUCTURE

Duration: 90 minutes

A chairperson leads the overall structure and content of the session, supported by up to 2 additional speakers who are all experts in the same field and, if needed a technical person or facilitator to show how the respective computer programme will be used on an interactive web platform.

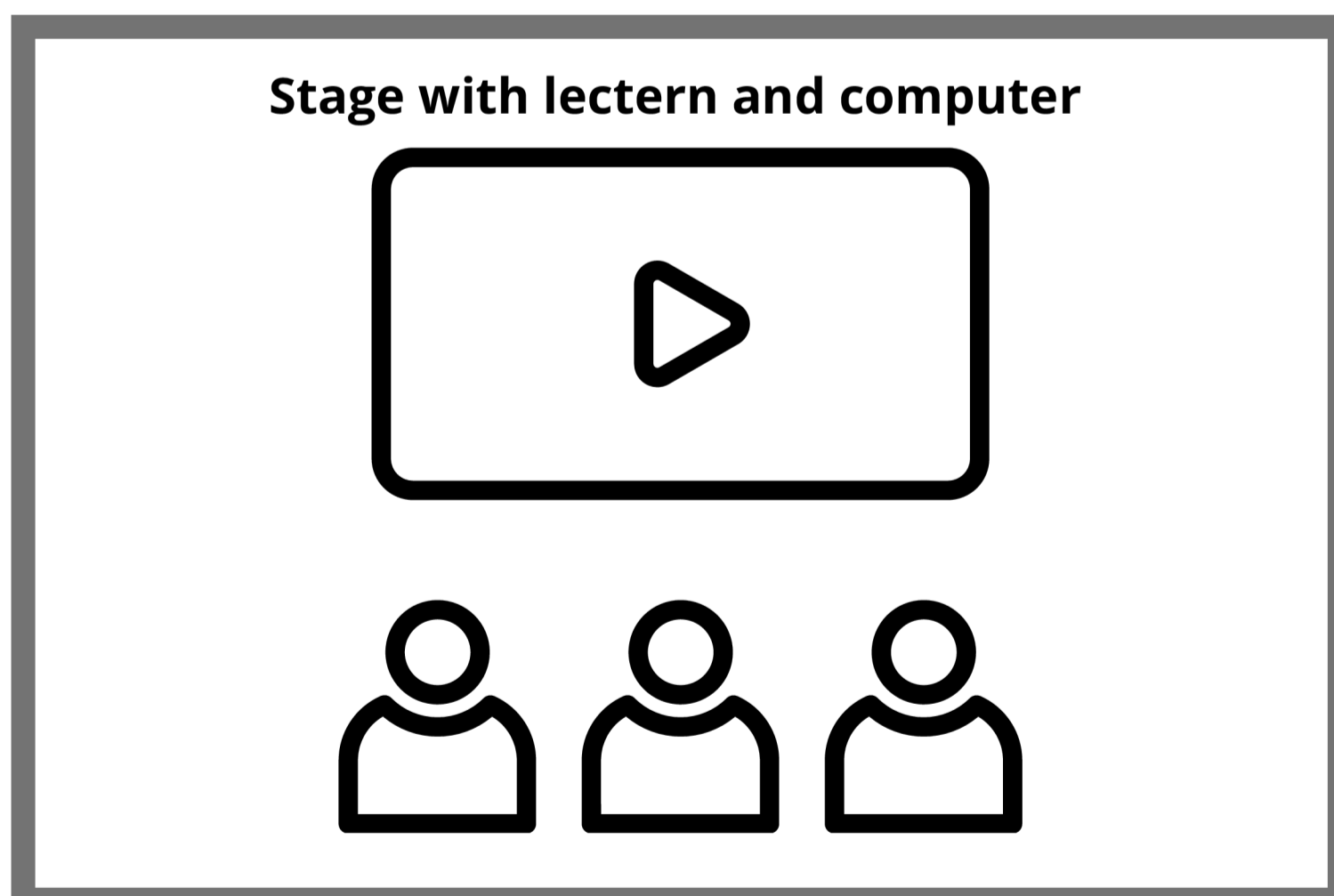
When proposing this session, please consider gender balance, geographical spread (ideally not more than one speaker per country), and make sure to include junior speakers. The chairperson has to be speaker as well as there are no benefits for the sole role of chairing a session.

- Please prepare a short didactic introduction at the beginning of the course.
- The chair or facilitator will give separate instructions on how to access and use the online application at the beginning of the session.
- Participants bring their own personal laptops so they can access the application during the course
- Participant will receive access to fully anonymized real patient datasets, learn about pitfalls, recognize patterns themselves.

ROOM SET-UP

Stage, lectern and big screen for audience, laptop at lectern.

Audience: table seating for up to 120 persons, additional row seating without tables available. Power outlets to charge computers and microphones for Q&A are provided

TEACHING MATERIAL

For a presentation to the entire audience, we kindly ask to upload the introductory slides to the Speakers' Service Centre as all material shown on the big screen is streamlined via the system. As Hands-on courses are not hybrid and are for onsite audience only, nothing will be recorded or shown as webcasts later on. Slides or images and other material needed for the utilised computer programme need to be uploaded on the provider system a few days before the course. A zoom call to show the programme will be offered before the congress if needed.

LEVELS

Attendees: Maximum 90 (registration for this session is mandatory)

What is the minimum level of experience/knowledge required?

Level 1 (Fundamental): Aimed mainly at general neurologists wanting to refresh or update their basic knowledge in the field, and potentially for residents in training.

Level 2 (Advanced): Targeted toward experienced neurologists wishing to develop and enhance further clinical knowledge and practice in a sub-specialty topic. A special emphasis will be provided to mid-career neurologists that aim to expand their knowledge in a specific domain.

Level 3 (Expert): Aimed at sub-specialist trainees, researchers or practitioners with a particular interest in that field, covering the latest advances in that domain.

BENEFITS

Speakers will be offered free registration to the congress, a travel grant and up to 2 nights of hotel accommodation.

PARTNER SOCIETIES

EAN has Memoranda of Understanding with several societies. Their session proposals will be developed together with the panels by the societies' representative.

For societies without representative, the proposal will be forwarded to the panel in charge for consideration.

Each partner society will be invited to label one of the accepted sessions as joint session.

Final decision on all sessions, lectures and speakers is with the Programme Committee.
